

Fundraising opportunities

BBC Children in Need (UK)

[The BBC Children in Need](#) provides grants for up to three years to properly constituted not for profit organisations working with disadvantaged young people aged 18 or under. Within the BBC Children in Need grants programme, organisations can apply for Small Grants of £10,000 or less per year for up to three years and for Main Grants of over £10,000 per year for up to three years.

Funding is available to organisations (including schools) that work with young people who are suffering from illness, distress, abuse or neglect, are disabled, have behavioural or psychological difficulties and / or are living in poverty or situations of deprivation.

Closing date for applications: 15 January 2012

The Dickie Bird Foundation

The Foundation offers grants to disadvantaged children under 18 to participate in the sport of their choice to improve their chances both inside and outside sport.

The Foundation's grants help with the cost of clothing and equipment for children to take part or continue in their chosen sport. It also makes a small contribution towards travel expenses within the UK.

[The Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust](#), which awards grants to charitable organisations in the United Kingdom and overseas, is seeking to fund projects that work with:

- Medical projects.

Grants are usually between £1,000 and £3,000. Exceptionally, grants of up to £10,000 are made, but these are usually for medical research projects.
